

S-130/S-190 Basic Firefighter II

(1) February 21, 22, 28 & Mar.1, 2026 (Two Weekends)

(2) April 4, 5, 11 & 12, 2026 (Two Weekends)

COST: \$ 250 per person NATR 101

***A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.**

Course includes S-130 Firefighter training, S-190 Introduction to Fire Behavior, I-100 Introduction to ICS and L-180 Human Factors. Fire Shelter as required prior to certification as an entry-level Firefighter (FFT2). Field exercise requires boots and gloves.

S-112 Intro to Chainsaw Operations (2025)

May 16-18, 2026

COST: \$ 250 per person

NATR 202

This BLENDED course is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills to perform the duties of the Basic Faller (FAL3) position. Students are required to complete the Online component of the course and pass the assessment prior to taking the Instructor-led component. The course lessons provide introduction to the function, maintenance and use of internal combustion engine powered chainsaws, and their tactical wildland fire application. The Instructor-led training will reinforce the content learned online and provide opportunities to apply this knowledge to real-world scenarios and practical exercises similar to Fireline situations.

PREREQUISITES: NONE

S-131 Advanced Fire Fighter NATR 121

March 16 & 17, 2026

COST: \$ 145 per person

***A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.**

S-131, Firefighter Type 1 is designed to meet the training needs of the Firefighter Type 1 (FFT1) and/or Incident Commander Type 5 (ICT5). Topics include operational leadership, communications, LCES, and tactical decision-making.

PREREQUISITE: S130/190/L180 –Qualified FFT II, 1 year experience

L-280 Followership to Leadership (2025)

March 9-10, 2026

NATR 102

COST: \$145 per person

***A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.**

Introduce students to fundamental leadership concepts and theories applicable to high-risk environments, enhancing their overall skill set and operational effectiveness. To provide students with small unit leadership opportunities to assess how prepared they are to step into a leadership role. Topics include leadership values and principles, decision-making tools, transition challenges for new leaders, situational leadership, team cohesion factors, ethical dilemmas, and briefing and debriefing techniques. Some course delivery may be arduous in nature.

PREREQUISITES: L-180, experience on incident assignments in operations or support functions.

S-290 Intermediate Fire Behavior (2025)

(1) April 6 & 7, 2026

NATR 104

COST: \$250 per person

***A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.**

The course lessons build upon the basics in S-190, and provide more detailed information on fuels, weather, and topography. They also provide a basis for analyzing variables and understanding how different interactions affect wildland fire behavior for firefighter safety. The online training will take approximately 22 hours to complete. Your progress will be saved as you move along. Students are required to complete the online component of the course and pass the assessment prior to taking the ILT portion. the instructor-led portion of the course..

PREREQUISITES: Successful completion of S-190 .

S-230 Crew Boss – Single Resource

April 13 & 14, 2026

NATR 115

COST: \$200 per person

***A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.**

S230 is a blended course, with an online training (OLT-3 hrs) component, and Instructor led training component (ILT- 11 hrs).

This course is designed to provide students with position,. Topics include travel and check-in in, briefings, assigning tasks and assessing crew performance, implementing fire line duties, mop-up, firing operations, using aerial resources, medical emergencies, and wildland urban interface.

PREREQUISITES: S-290 , Qualified FFT1

S-231 Engine Boss – Single Resource

April 15 & 16, 2026

NATR 117

COST: \$200 per person

***A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.**

Instructor-Led Delivery/Component.

This is a skill course designed to produce student proficiency in the performance of the duties associated with Engine Boss, Single Resource (ENGB). Topics include engine and crew capabilities and limitations, information sources, fire size up considerations, tactics, and wildland/urban interface.

PREREQUISITES: S-230, Qualified FFT 1

S-200 - Initial Attack IC

(1) April 23 & 24, 2026

NATR 109

COST: \$145 per person

***A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.**

This course will provide the individual in charge of the initial attack of small, non-complex fires, the training needed for size-up, deployment of forces, suppression, mop up, communications, and administrative duties.

PREREQUISITES: Qualified as any Single Resource Boss .

S-215 Fire Operations in Urban Interface

April 20-22, 2026

NATR 116

COST: \$239 per person

***A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.**

Meets training needs for initial attack incident commanders and company officers confronting wildland fire threatening life, property, and improvements. Units include: size-up, initial strategy and action plan, structure triage, tactics, action plan assessment, public relations and follow-up and safety.

PREREQUISITES: S130/190, S-131, Qualified FFT1

M-410 Facilitative Instructor

January 26-30, 2026

WORK 0921

COST: \$550 per person

This 36-hour course trains existing and potential instructors on how to prepare and present effective training programs. Key areas include written performance and instructional objectives, preparation of lesson plans, preparation and operation of audio-visual aids and equipment, various methods of communication, individual and team presentations, management of classroom learning environments and use of testing procedures. Evening break-out sessions and actual classroom demonstrations/presentations are integral parts of this course. 8 -16 hours of pre-work are required.
