

S-130/S-190 Basic Firefighter II

(1) Jan. 21, 22, 28 & 29, 2023 (Two Weekends)
(2) April 15, 16, 22 & 23, 2023

COST: \$ 250 per person

NATR 101

**A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.*

Course includes S-130 Firefighter training, S-190 Introduction to Fire Behavior, I-100 Introduction to ICS and L-180 Human Factors. Fire Shelter as required prior to certification as an entry-level firefighter (FFT2). Field exercise requires boots and gloves.

S-131 Advanced Fire Fighter Training + S133 Look Up, Look Down, Look Around

April 7 & 8, 2023

COST: \$145 per person

NATR 121

**A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.*

Additional instruction at the Advanced Firefighter/Squad Boss (FFT1) level including training on tactics and safety. This course is designed to be interactive containing several exercises designed to facilitate group discussion.

PREREQUISITES: S130/190, 180 –Qualified FFT II plus 1 year of actual field experience

S-200 - Initial Attack IC

April 24 & 25, 2023

COST: \$139 per person

NATR 109

**A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.*

This course will provide the individual in charge of the initial attack of small, non-complex fires, the training needed for size-up, deployment of forces, suppression, mop up, communications, and administrative duties.

PREREQUISITES: S-130/190, S-290, S230 Qualified Single Resource Boss.

S-215 Fire Operations in Urban Interface

April 10-12, 2023

COST: \$239 per person

NATR 116

**A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.*

Meets training needs for initial attack incident commanders and company officers confronting wildland fire threatening life, property, and improvements. Units include: size-up, initial strategy and action plan, structure triage tactics, action plan assessment, public relations and follow-up and safety. S130/190, S-131, Qualified FFTI

S-290 Intermediate Fire Behavior

(1) April 3-6, 2023

COST: \$250 per person

NATR 104

**A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.*

S-290 is designed to meet training requirements to work in the ICS Operations Section as a Single Resource Boss. Course will instruct prospective frontline supervisors in wildland fire behavior for effective and safe fire management operations.

PREREQUISITES: S-130/190, plus one year experience recommended

S-230 Crew Boss – Single Resource

April 17-19, 2023

COST: \$199 per person

NATR 115

**A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.*

The S-230 is designed to meet the training needs of a crew boss on a wildland fire incident. Topics include: preparation, mobilization, tactics and safety, off line duties and demobilization.

PREREQUISITES: S-290 Required, S-130/190, Qualified FFTI

S-231 Engine Boss – Single Resource

April 20 & 21, 2023

COST: \$149 per person

NATR 117

**A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.*

S-231 is an interactive course that provides examples and exercises specific to the performance and duties of an engine boss.

PREREQUISITES: S-130/190, S-230, S-290, Qualified FFTI

L-280 Followership to Leadership

April 14 & 15, 2023 (Weekend)

COST: \$139 per person

NATR 102

**A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.*

This training course is designed as a self-assessment opportunity for individuals preparing to step into a leadership role. The course combines one day of classroom instruction followed by a second day in the field with students working through a series of problem solving events in small teams (Field Leadership Assessment Course).

PREREQUISITES: L-180, experience on incident assignments in operations or support functions.

S-212 Wildfire Power Saws

May 20, 21 & 22, 2023

COST: \$ 250 per person

NATR 202

**A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.*

Wildland Fire Chain Saws, S-212, is an instructor-led course intended to be presented at the local level. The course lessons provide introduction to the function, maintenance and use of internal combustion engine powered chain saws, and their tactical wildland fire application. Field exercises support entry level training for firefighters with little or no previous experience in operating a chain saw, providing hands-on cutting experience in surroundings similar to field situations. **** Successful completion for entry level. Does not constitute certified faller.**

PREREQUISITES: Qualified FFT2, Basic First Aid and CPR Card.

S-330 Task Force/Strike Team Leader

March 13—15, 2023

COST: \$ 250 per person

NATR 123

**A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.*

This course meets the training requirements for Task Force and Strike Team Leader positions. The class is open to Single Resource Bosses and Initial Attack Incident Commanders.

PREREQUISITES: S-290, S-230, Qualified Single Resource Boss

S-390 Fire Behavior Calculations

March 6—9, 2023

COST: \$265 per person

NATR 122

**A minimum of 10 registrants is required for this class.*

This course instills trainees in fire behavior calculations with emphasis on the use of nomograms in assessment or potential for extreme fire conditions. Key topics include: evaluation and input of field data to calculate the behavior for rate of spread, fire intensity, flame length, maximum spotting distances and safe control tactics. Must be Single Resource Boss qualified.

PREREQUISITES: S-290, S-230, Qualified Single Resource Boss
